Measures at the EAEU Level

 Till June 30th: List of goods that are essential for internal EAEU market and for which <u>temporary bans</u> or <u>quantitative restrictions</u> on exports may be imposed in exceptional cases







- onion, garlic, turnip, rye, rice, buckwheat, millet, cereals, coarse meal, granulated cereals, ready to use buckwheat products, crushed and non-crushed soybeans, and sunflower seeds
- In Kazakhstan: inclusion of cattle and breeding chickens to this list

Measures at the EAEU Level

• Till September 30th : non-tariff regulation measures



COVID 19: FOCUS ON RUSSIA

Till September 30, 2020: suspenion of VAT on COVID-19 test kits, face masks, respirators and other
protective equipment, air filtration and purification equipment, ventilators and medicines used to treat
COVID-19

- Increased demand on import / export of several products: new market opportunities
- TRAVEL TO RUSSIA

Quarantine for 2 weeks for all people coming from UE countries, China, Iran, South Korea, the USA, Great Britain, Ukraine, Belarus

FOCUS ON KAZAKHSTAN

- taxpayers classified as micro, small or medium-sized enterprises were granted a deferred payment period for all taxes and other
 mandatory payments to the budget as well as for social payments until 1 June 2020
- ban on export from the territory for certain products buckwheat, buckwheat groats, sugar, potatoes, sunflower seeds, sunflower oi was introduced
- Quotas to export from Kazakhstan of wheat flour or wheat-rye flour; soft wheat and meslin; seed potatoes; raw sunflower oil, unrefined in primary packages with a net volume of 10 liters or less; raw sunflower oil, unrefined in primary packages with a net volume of more than 10 liters
- «red and yellow channels» at the border
- VAT rates of 8% are established for imports of goods included in the list of socially essential food products (applicable till the end of October)
- · on-site scheduled Customs inspections cancelled
- property tax rate "0" for legal entities
- land tax rate "0" for agricultural land of agricultural producers
- export customs duty (ECD) rate "0" until the end of this year for exported light oil products



EUROPEAN UNION

- exportation of certain products subject to the production of an export authorization: limitation no longer applicable since May 25th 2020

- EU restrictive measures against Russia extended until **31 January 2021**

Journeys

In Belgium

- You are allowed to move around freely.
- If you are using public transport (bus, tram or train) and are you older than 12 years of age, wear a face mask or a scarf covering your mouth and nose.

Abroad

- Non essential travels limited to the European Union countries, United Kingdom, Switzerland, Liechtenstein, Iceland, Norway and <u>some countries outside of Europe</u>.
 Rules may be different in each country. Check the rules on https://diplomatie.belgium.be/en or on the website of the European Union
- For <u>essential travels</u>, no limitation for: mariners, persons attending meetings of international organisations, students and highly qualified personnel (!with VISA!)
- EU+ citizens and third-country nationals legally residing in the European Union, as well as their family members, can travel wherever they wish in the EU+, including Belgium, and no longer only in their country of residence

Among others: postponement of the tax filing deadline, deferred payment of personal income tax, withholding tax, VAT and social security contributions, financial incencitives (ex: 4,000 EUR for companies which were forced to close), Employee incentive premium; facilities for temporary unemployment etc...

Belgium: legal protections during Covid crisis

- Temporary moratorium for companies
- Freezing of insolvency actions against Belgians debtor's
- Freezing of seizures of goods of Belgian companies (not applicable since the end of June)
- Postponement of Shareholder Meetings for approval of the annual accounts

Legal issues: is the coronavirus a valid excuse for breach or not fulfillement of the contract?

- Force majeure: unforeseeable circumstances that prevent someone from fulfilling a contract
- Force majeure prevents the contracting party from being considered responsible for breach of contract. After all, no one is bound by the impossible
- CORONAVIRUS = Force majeure ? NO
- Restrictive governmental measures = force majeure? : YES
